

HEALTH TOPIC PRESENTATION

General

1. Each student will be given, approximately, an 8-9 minute time slot.
2. Five to six presentations will take place each day.
3. **Students need to be organized and ready to go.** There will be no extra time to go to your locker. Bring all your items to class. There will be no passes during presentations.
4. Be on time. Students will not be let into the classroom, if a presentation is in progress. Once a presentation is completed late students will be allowed in class. **Be respectful of your classmates.**

Your time slot consists and other responsibilities

1. Set up your board (visual aid) – I will have plate stands to hold your board.
2. Hand Mrs. Winiarski-Kuzdak your presentation rubric. I need your rubric to grade you.
3. Pass out your handouts – one per student + one for Mrs. Winiarski-Kuzdak.
4. Once this is completed, Mrs. Winiarski-Kuzdak will ask you if you are ready to begin.
5. When ready, Mrs. Winiarski-Kuzdak will start the stopwatch.
6. Your actual presentation (talk time) should be between 3 and 5 minutes.
7. When you have completed your 3-5 minute talk time, you will answer questions from your classmates &/or Mrs. Winiarski-Kuzdak. Be prepared
8. When question and answer time is completed, you will collect your handouts.
9. You will take your handouts home to grade.
10. You will alphabetize your handouts, by student's last name.
11. When you return the following day, give Mrs. Winiarski-Kuzdak your alphabetized handouts. She will place the grades into the Zangle.

Other

1. You have been working on this project since March. You should have a pretty good understanding of your topic.
2. You can still present if you do not have a handout or a visual aid.
3. There is no time to reschedule. The two days after the presentations are the days of final exams.
4. Double check the date you chose to present and make sure you do not have any conflicts – i.e. doctor's appointment

Remember

1. You may use note cards. Refer to them, but do not read them, your board or papers.
2. Refer to your rubric for scoring and clarification.
3. If you need further clarification, ask prior to your actual presentation.
4. If you turned in your handout, on time, I will make your copies. Otherwise that is your responsibility.
